Keith Carver shares his experiences photographing two continents

So far it looks pretty darned good.

Award-winning nature photographer Keith Carver addressed club members Nov. 29 with his presentation entitled, "My Photographic Journey...So Far," and the members were impressed with what they saw.

Carver called his work, "A privileged journey for me," as he shared a selection of photos from about 20 years of exploration of the beauty and behavior of birds and other wildlife in North America from Alaska to Maine to Florida, Central America and Africa. He included images of landscapes, seascapes and night skies.

One of his favorite sites is Bonaventure Island off the Gaspe Peninsula in Canada. Atop the island is a colony of 120,000 Northern gannets which feature (Continued on Page 3)

5½ to 6-foot wingspans and make a living diving for fish. Carver said he likes to use burst mode on his Canon equipment to capture the best shots.

Carver contrasted the conditions in Namibia to those in Costa Rica. Namibia sees about six inches of rain annually while Costa Rica tallies more than 10 feet. The African nation has few colors and they are muted

because it is so dry there. Costa Rica on the other hand is known for its brilliant, varied colors.


