Study light, story and gesture before shooting a landscape

By JIM GILLEN

Michael Zide agrees that most photographers want to show what they've done, they want to exhibit, to share their work as any artist would.

But first, he told the Springfield Photographic Society on March 28, you must observe.

Quoting Elliott Erwitt, a photographer known for incorporating irony, pun and humor in his work while also producing photographs that are sober and emotive, Zide said observation should include the search for light, story and gesture.

Zide suggested visualizing the idea before shooting the photograph. And to avoid the disappointment of setting up a photo from one angle only to learn you have missed the shot when the photo is viewed on the computer, Zide recommends shooting the landscape from different spots – move around the subject – and using different lenses to ensure better results.

A landscape photographer should react to what he/she sees and seek the best mood and composition, he said.

A well-accomplished self-taught photographer, Zide asked the audience what interesting photographs have in common. The answers:

- •There is an emotional connection
- They reveal a truth
- They tell a story

Zide has photographs in numerous collections including the D'Amour Museum of Fine Art in Springfield, the Santa Barbara Museum of Art, Mead Art Museum at Amherst College, the Cape Cod Museum of Art, the Museum of Contemporary Art at the University of Massachusetts in Amherst, the Smith College Art Museum, the Mt. Holyoke College Art Museum, and the Wellington Management Corporate Art Collection, China.

He has taught at the Hallmark Institute of Photography the Maine Media Workshops, the Martha's Vineyard School of Photography, the Nathan Mayhew Seminars, and the Chilmark School of Photography.
