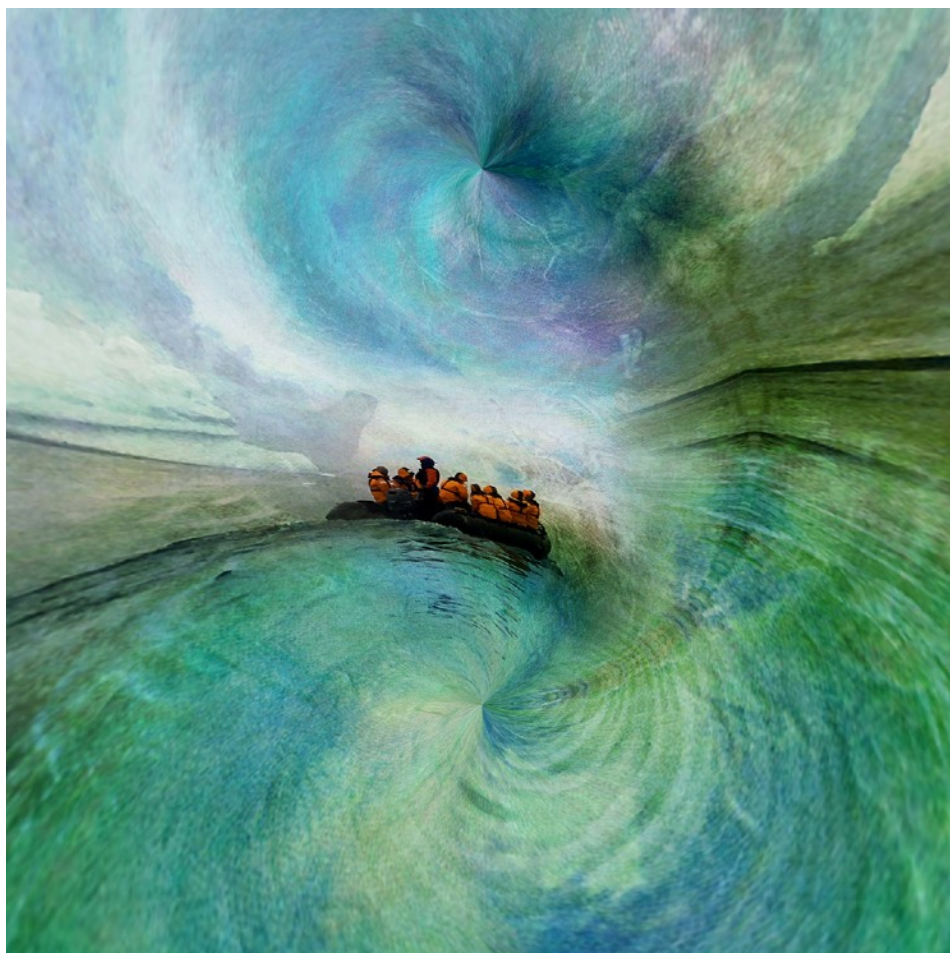

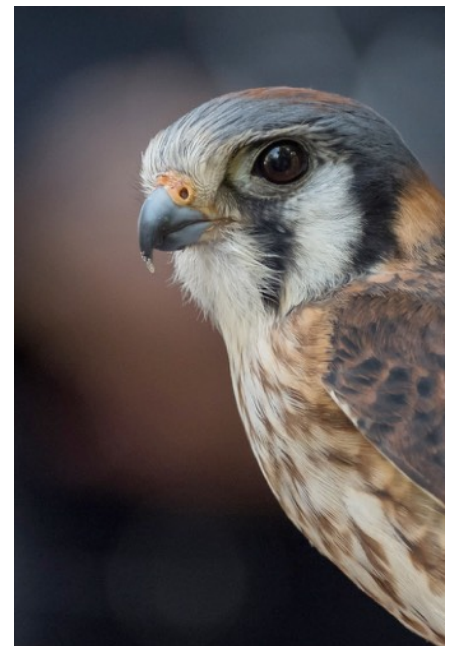

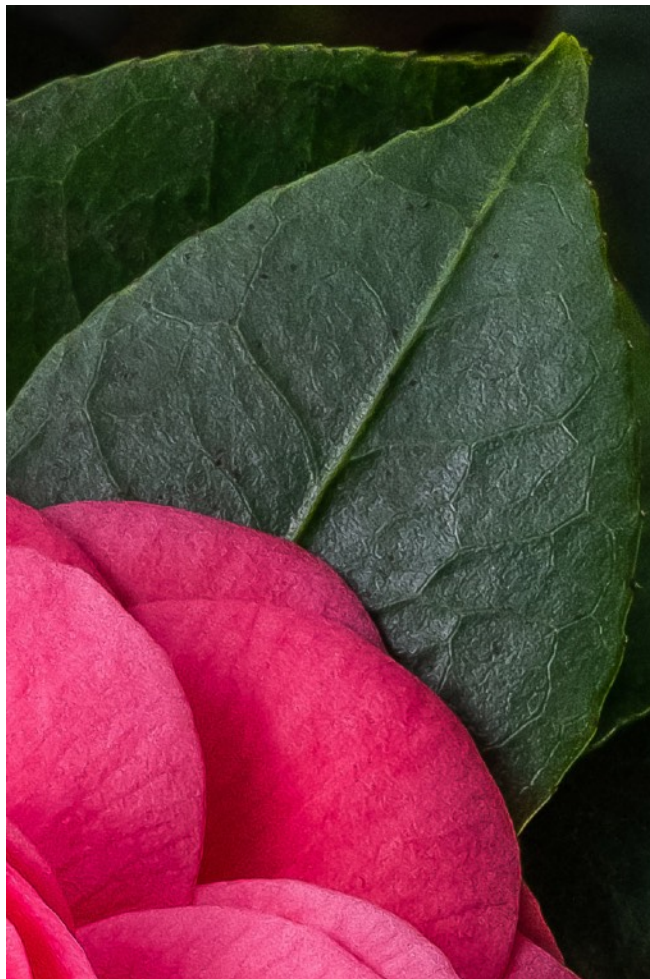
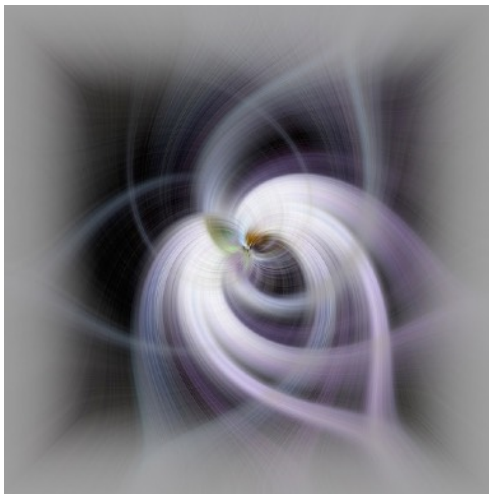
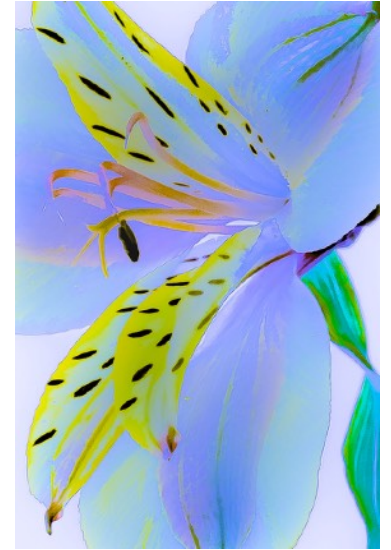
move through all the seasons this year.

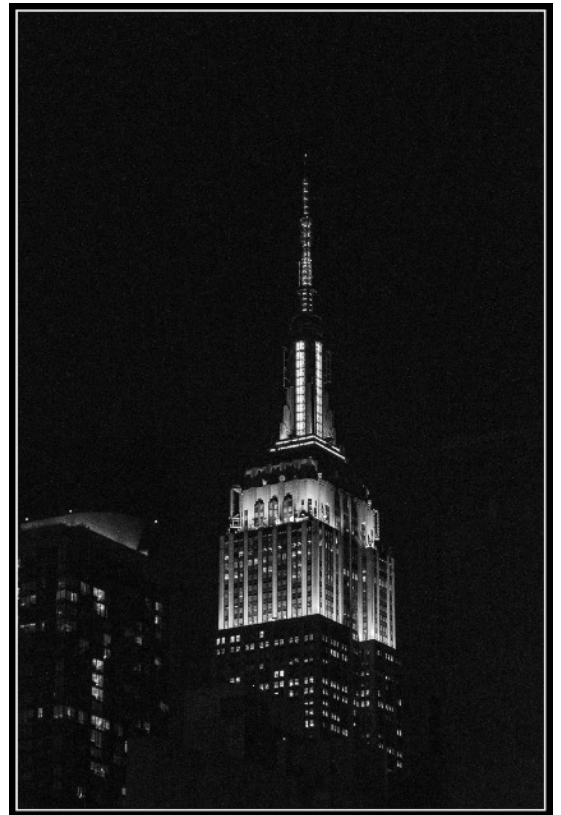
Many of the pictures they have chosen include rivers and streams, lakes and ponds. We have not seen any that have people in them.

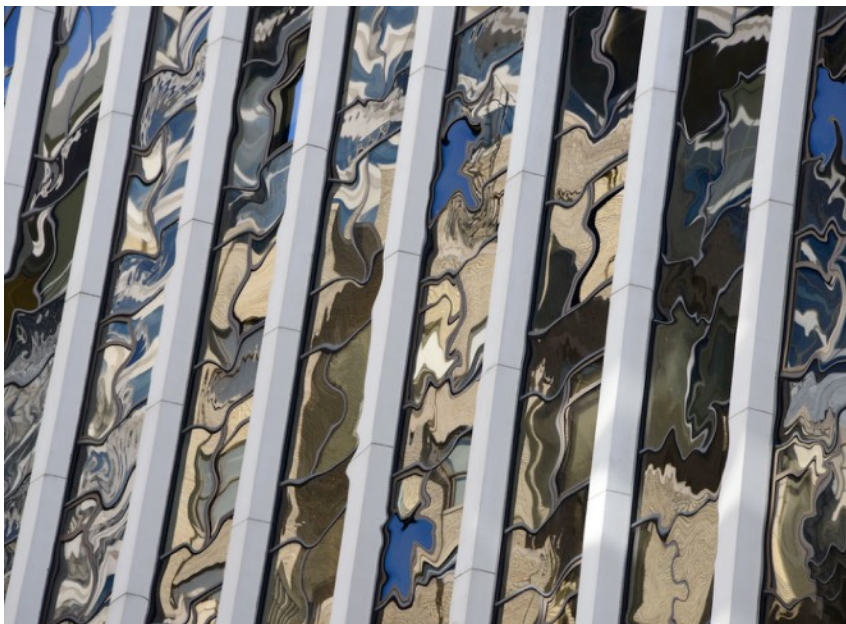

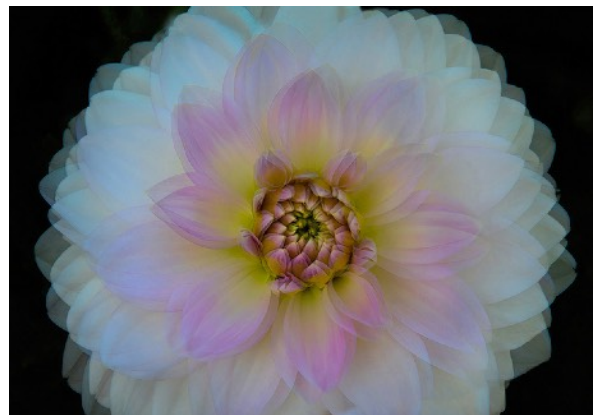

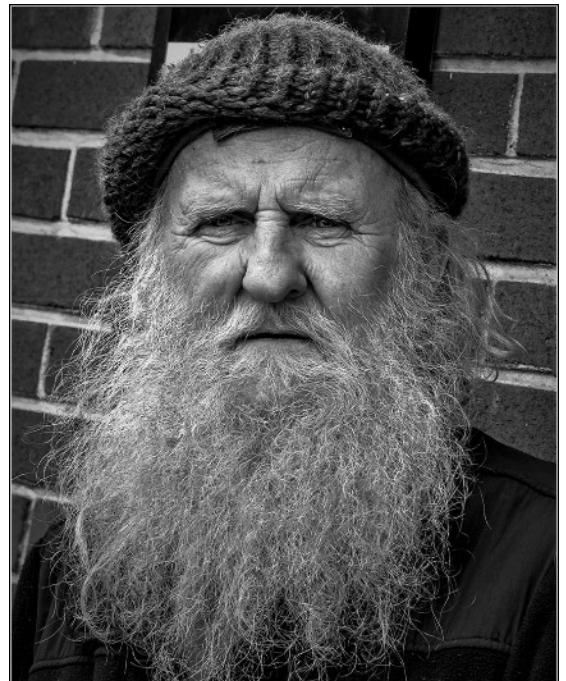

## Stephan Platzer to discuss sailing books in Enfield

SPS member Stephan Platzer will speak about two books he has written about sailing at the Enfield Central Public Library on June 19 at 6:30 p.m.

Members of SPS are welcome to attend his presentation which will include photographs from his experience aboard the Ernestina in 1982. His book, "Bringing E Home – Transatlantic Voyage of Schooner Ernestina 1982," recounts how he was one of six Americans who sailed the Ernestina from Cape Verde to

Newport, R.I. in 1982. The vessel is the second oldest in the United States.

A sailboat enthusiast throughout his adult life, Stephan also is the author of "Everybody has a Sunfish Story." He received a green Sunfish as a high school graduation gift and it became the source of 50 years of adventures, connections and friendships. His first book draws from the many experiences that family and friends have shared of their own stories surrounding the Sunfish.
