Dave Roback

A moment in time. As a news photographer for the last 40 plus years, I have been chasing that fleeting

moment, trying to capture it, while allowing others to experience those images in publication and online. Quick and dirty from the



black and white time of cooking HC-110 developer and Acufine to transmitting photos digitally minutes later from the front seat of a car, it is finally time to start slowing down.


A bit of history. The first time I picked up a camera was my father's Konica rangefinder. That led to my first photo class under a master photographer, teacher, lifelong friend, mentor and former news photographer Sylvian Ofiara at Manchester Community College in Connecticut.

I originally wanted to be a sportswriter. My lack of spelling skills pushed me toward photography. If I could write and take photos, I would have a leg up on breaking into the newspaper business.

Next stop, the University of South Carolina with a degree in journalism. Connections at the school allowed me to continue my craft at the Beaufort, SC, Gazette with a stop at the Holyoke Transcript-Telegram, and finally the

Springfield Newspapers where I spent 35 years.

Two phrases that are popular in the newspaper business, "Jack of all trades and master of none" and "f/8 and be there." In the 40 years of grinding out images, making those crazy deadlines, sometimes within minutes of taking the photo, it was not always pretty and technically close to being perfect. It was the best job I could ever imagine. There are places I have been and experiences I would have never witnessed if I did not have that Olympus, Canon or Nikon around my neck.

Now, semi-retirement has come knocking at the door. I still shoot on a regular basis for The Reminder Publications filling two pages in three different editions with local sports photos. I also freelance for Wilbraham and Monson Academy capturing their sports programs. There is also the occasional assignment from The Republican, the Holyoke School System, and Baystate Medical Center.


I was so impressed with the end-of-season slide show and the exhibit at the museums I said to myself, "I would like to join and try this." Along the way, I have learned this craft on the street from many of the talented photographers on the newspapers I worked with. I hope to continue this trend here at the Springfield Photographic Society. The luxury of taking time to capture an image and have almost limitless time to work with it is something I look forward to.






